MINUTES

- I. Call to orderMr. Fritsch called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.
- II. Special awards and presentationsThere were no special awards or presentations.
- III. Update from BHS Student Advisory Council representatives
 Student Representative Ben Stone updated the School Committee. At BHS; last
 Wednesday senior students attended a Credit for Life Fair at Ware High School
 sponsored by Country Bank for Savings, the end of the third term is Friday, students will
 be attending a Teen Mental Health and Depression conference with teachers tomorrow,
 students will be attending a Government Day in Boston on Thursday, the Senior Show
 will be Friday, April 10, the BHS Bands will perform at Boston Symphony Hall on
 Saturday, April 11, and next Friday BHS students will participate in the National Day of
 Silence put on by the LGBT club. At CHCS students are participating in an experimental
 learning experience about maple sugaring, PARCC has been completed and the annual
 5K walk run took place. At JBMS, there will be a Sip & Paint fundraiser tomorrow
 evening and they also completed PARCC.

VI. Reports and recommendations of the Superintendent

A. FY 16 School Budget presentation and recommendation Superintendent Coffin presented the FY 16 School Budget.

Level Service Budget: \$29,138,207

School choice would be used to cover needs budget. Per the Finance Committee \$243,000 was cut from the budget. Superintendent Coffin spoke to the reductions.

Superintendent Coffin noted that enrollment has changed over time. Kindergarten is up for the coming year, approximately 150 students, while the Kindergarten grant is now gone. Needs for the district would include; Social emotional SPED program at BHS, attendance/substitute online program, technology, director of curriculum, 2 coaches and ticket taker at BHS, writing workshop PD, .5 guidance counselor at CSS, summer secretarial assistance at CSS and SRE, a custodian at CHCS, Siemens bond, Central Office handicap access, and a .5 nursing position.

Graduation rate is 95.1% for the district, with the rate for students attending K-12 in district being 96.8%. Mr. Fritsch questioned, level funded is \$29,548,218, what is the % over the town; Mr. Dunn noted it was 1.9%. Ms. Bogdanovich questioned the teacher staffing, Superintendent Coffin noted that staffing has been moved to accommodate. Dr. Knapp noted that school choice money has helped to balance the budget.

 Ms. Bogdanovich noted she did not attend the meeting. Mr. Fritsch noted that the Collaborative has a new Blog.

 Dr. Knapp noted there will be a meeting April 28th to talk about Advanced Math.
 - C. Healthy & Safer Schools Advisory Committee (Ms. Bogdanovich) Mr. Cameron noted there will be a meeting in May.

A. Update from Jessica's Boundless Playground Committee
Mr. Eric Weiss updated the School Committee on Jessica's Boundless Playground. The
Grand Opening will be held in August or September. Mr. Weiss noted the help of
everyone involved including Mt. View Landscaping, Bob Lachance, and Ed Weigel. He
remarked that the playground will be a legacy for our town. The committee still exists
but is making plans to disband. Ms. Bogdanovich questioned whether they are done
fundraising. Mr. Weiss noted that other than a town warrant for \$49,000 for rubber
surfacing they have completed fundraising. Mr. Fritsch commended all those
involved. Ms. Bodganovich questioned who was responsible for the playground. Mr.
