- V. Reports and recommendations of the Superintendent Superintendent Coffin noted May will have second year of PARCC testing grades 3-8. 5th and 8th grade Science MCAS will be at the end of May. It was noted that the state has cut down on the amount of testing.

A. Budget update FY 2017

Mr. Dunn updated the Committee with the FY 2017 budget numbers. Dr. Knapp asked for historical documents with regard to town income and expense statements. Mr. Dunn will try to find some older documents. Dr. Knapp is interested in how the town's budget has changed over past years. Mr. Fritsch questioned when the budget would be online. Superintendent Coffin was hopeful by Friday. Ms. French asked what is the best way to direct people. Superintendent Coffin noted there will be a parent meeting at CHCS library, 7:00 pm to look into settin up an educational foundation. This foundation to fund projects in the district. It was noted that the foundation would take time to implement.

A. School Committee summer budget & finance workshop

Mr. Fritsch suggested a meeting with the Finance Committee to explain income and expense sheets. How the town arrives at their numbers. Would like to arrange something for this summer. Dr. Laughner suggested they should include what their process is. It is suggest that the finance and budget process start earlier.

## C. School supply lists for students

This was a suggestion by a parent. The Committee discussed the usefulness of a school supply list. Ms. French noted we are one of the few districts that does not have one. Ms. Bogdanovich suggested looking for corporate donations. Mr. Cameron noted a supply list cannot be required. Ms. Bogdanovich notes it would be suggested or a donation to the classroom. Superintendent Coffin suggested a unified list by school.

### D. Potential parent "opt-out hard copy" procedure

Superintendent Coffin noted this is another suggestion by a parent. Ms. Bogdanovich had suggested previously the "virtual backpack". Ms. French noted that Ms. Vigneux does send out a Monday morning memo. These suggestions save money on paper and less mailings. Superintendent Coffin suggests to start with an opt-out with hard copies available and that cutting back on hard copies would be helpful. Ben Stone questioned whether there is a way to do this with the summer mailings packets. Superintendent Coffin and the leadership team will look at this.
