Minutes

- I. Call to orderMr. Fritsch called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.
- Special awards and presentations
 - A. Recognition of Clare Popowich, Years of Service to School Committee Mr. Fritsch recognized Ms. Popowich for her 6 years of service to the School Committee. Ms. Popowich thanked the many people she has worked with in the past 6 years. She spoke to her 6 years of service and the honor and privilege of working. Ms. Popowich noted her concerns from this year and her concerns of the coming years in the district.
 - B. Recognition of BHS student Kathleen Sera Royal National Merit Scholar Superintendent Coffin recognized Kathleen Sera Royal as the National Merit Scholar.
 - C. Recognition of BHS students Lily Stowe-Alekman, Lydia Funk, Isabelle Griffin New England Outdoor Writers Winners
 Superintendent Coffin recognized the three winners of the New England Outdoor Writers. Lydia Funk read her work titled "An Old Woman".
- III. Update from BHS Student Advisory Council representativesBen Stone updated the School Committee.CSS; students are studying plants and weather. They are planting seeds in the

playground gardens and will be visited by Nick Bannin, Channel 22 meteorologist, on May 18th to learn how to become Junior Weather Watchers.

SRE; Family Art Night in conjunction with Book Fair, was held last Thursday, May 7th. Book Fair sales totaled over \$7,000.

CHCS; Mass Reading Book Awards Pizza Party was held on May 7th. Teachers participated in the Writesteps Professional Development on May 7th.

 - A. Recommendation to approve insignia on new BHS Scoreboard (Marilyn Higgins) Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to accept the new scoreboard with the new insignia.

Discussion: Superintendent Coffin presented the request for the new scoreboard. Dr. Knapp questioned what the policy is for naming? Superintendent Coffin and Mr. Fritsch noted there is no district policy for naming other than buildings. Ms. Bogdanovich noted the new scoreboard is being funded by the Coaches Fund. Ms. Popowich mentioned concerns that not every person in the school has the ability to fund a school item to be named for them posthumously. Dr. Knapp noted the tennis courts are named for Marilyn Higgins.

Discussion: Superintendent Coffin presented the trip request. Fingerprinting policy required all overnight chaperones to be fingerprinted and they will be for the trip.

B. BHS Out of State Field Trip Request – Roger Williams Zoo

Discussion: Students from the junior class at BHS spoke to the request. They would like to kick off their senior year with this field trip. A vote was taken amongst the class with 140 voting to go to the zoo. Dr. Knapp questioned the cost. It was noted that the cost is \$40 with seats for 140 calculated. Ms. Scudere noted if there was more interest they would increase the number busses.
