## Pledge of Allegiance

- I. Call to orderMs. French called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
- II. Public comment regarding items on the agenda
  There were no public comments regarding items on the agenda.
- III. Special awards and presentationsSuperintendent Coffin noted there were no special awards or presentation this evening.

IV. Update from BHS Student Advisory Council representatives Parker Mas updated:

CSS: students screened last week, visiting day on September 6th, and bus drivers came to visit and talk about safety.

SRE: Fall enrichment will start on Oct 11th during recess periods.

CHCS: Open house will be on Tuesday, September 14th, from 6:30-7:30 pm.

JBMS: Open house will be on Thursday, September 29th from 6:30 - 8:15. The Band will perform for the Belchertown Fair.

BHS: Open house will be on Thursday, September 15th from 6:00 - 8:00. Thursday, September 22 the BHS Band will perform at the Big E on the Storrowton Green at 3:45 followed by the Big E parade. The Band will also perform at the Belchertown Fair.

V. Approval of minutes (A.I.)

A. August 23, 2016 Regular Session

Motion: Dr. Knapp moved to accept the August 23, 2016 minutes as presented.

Second: Ms. Bogdanovich

Vote: 5,0,0

VI. Reports and recommendations of the Superintendent

A. Report on student enrollment and school choice enrollment
Superintendent Coffin noted that the opening of the school year went smoothly.
Thanked the staff for being there and being ready to start. She also thanks the parents
for having students ready to begin. Superintendent Coffin attended the SRE open house
last week.

Superintendent Coffin noted student enrollment is 13 more than last year. There were 122 school choice last year this year the number is 135. There are 2,229 in district students, with fewer "choicing" out than in.

Mr. O'Connor questioned how many choice out of district. It was noted that 32 special ed are choiced out, the regular ed number will be looked into.

### B. CSS orientation information

Ms. Bremer spoke to the CSS orientation, what they do at CSS for orientation. It starts in March with registration, next, at the beginning of school year is screening, then there is visiting day. There is a staggered entrance for the Kindergarten students, half day on Thursday and half a day on Friday. Ms. Bremer also noted that CSS has 4 student teachers this year. Ms. Bremer spoke to the development of an improved report card that would include social emotional standards. They are working toward a draft for the

end of the year.

# C. STEM update (S. Fortin)

Dr. Fortin updated the Committee. Eric Lesser got an amendment passed through legislature that will give \$100,000 to Belchertown High School toward STE program. The money to be spent on materials and/or equipment in the Science, Technology, and Engineering programs. They have started pre-planning what would be the best use of the funds. Committee members questioned the uses of the funds. Dr. Fortin noted he is checking on the specifics of spending the funds. Specifics are still being worked on among the committees.

D. Senator Lesser's Visit to BHS – September 21st, 10 a.m.

Ms. French reminded the public that Senator Lesser will be visiting BHS on September 21st at 10 am.

## VII. Personnel

A. Personnel update & practicum students

Superintendent Coffin updated the Committee on the recent hires for the district. Kevin Martin as the new Food Service Director, comes with experience at Smith College and Williston. Other hires were; Julie Hopkins, Gina Perry, Lindsay Laplante, Nicole Ritter, Jessica Hanson, Nancy Voyer, Joan Hilliard, and Regis Paris. Superintendent Coffin noted that CHCS is working on defining what they want in a Library/Media specialist. There will be 15 Student interns in the district this year, 4 at CSS, 1 at SRE, 2 at CHCS, 4 at JBMS, 2 at BHS and 2 at district.

## B. Appointment of School Physician

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to appoint Dr. Leopold to the position of school physician for the 2016/17 school year.

Second: Dr. Laughner

Vote: 5,0,0

Superintendent Coffin recommended Dr. Talia Leopold for the position of school physician. Dr. Leopold has been serving as the school physician for the past couple of years. Ms. Bogdanovich asked what the school physician did. Ms. DuComb noted that they helped with difficult medical decisions, had an open door policy for the school nurses, wrestler's weights.

## VIII. Unfinished business

There was no unfinished business at this time.

#### IX. New business

A. Accept Walmart Community Grant donation for JBMS

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to accept the \$750 Walmart Donation to Jabish after

B. Approve revision to Policy JEBA-Preschool Peer Student Eligibility

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to approve the revision to policy JEBA

Second: Dr. Laughner

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Superintendent Coffin noted that the Committee received the policy previously with the strike out portion. Changed in the policy is "all children have to be 3

years by September 1st. Special needs children have exceptions."

Dr. Knapp questioned if this could affect the enrollment? Mr. Cameron noted that they

are always looking for peer students.

# C. Approve Policy GBEC-R, Drug Free Workplace

Superintendent Coffin noted there is changed wording in the last paragraph to include field trips. It was noted that the School Committee approves policy but is just informed with changes in procedure.

D. Consider request for rate increase for private music teachers

Motion: Dr. Laughner moved to increase the fees for private lesson teacher from \$18 to

\$20.

Second: Ms. Bogdanovich

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Superintendent Coffin recommended the increase in lesson fees. Mr. Mosall is the lesson coordinator. The instructors are CORI checked and fingerprinted.

Dr. Knapp questioned why the school is setting the rates. Superintendent Coffin noted that policy was that the Committee set the fees. Mr. Dunn noted that in general the School Committee sets the fees for the district. The private lesson teachers are district employees. Mr. Charron noted there is a benefit in standardized fees.

E. BHS Senior Class Out of State Field Trip Request-Community Service, Granby, CT

Motion: Dr. Knapp moved to approve the field trip request.

Second: Ms. Bogdanovich

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Matt Davidsohn, class president, presented the request. The trip is scheduled for September 26th. The class will stop at the fairgrounds for help clean up before heading to High Meadow. This spot has been used in the past for the senior class trips. Dr. Laughner noted that field trip requests should reach the School Committee earlier.

# F. Clean drinking water (R. Lachance)

Mr. Lach ance noted that the plan is to test all water sites in 3 stages. Mass DEP grant was applied for this summer. They were approved to go through the process. Testing all water that students drink. In conjunction with UMass there are 150-175 sites that will be tested in the district. This would cost the district \$75,000-\$100,000 if the district had to pay for it. The sampling to be completed by October 31st. Results will be available on the website. The district has been testing 1 or 2 sites since 1988. This program will allow us to test all sites in the district. There are contingency plans if any results come back negative.

# G. Minimum wage increase – Jan. 1, 2017 discussion

Mr. Dunn spoke to the update. Municipalities are not bound by the minimum wage increase. The was increase would affect 3 groups, para subs, food service subs, and AV techs.

Superintendent Coffin recommends the increase as of January 1st.

Dr. Laughner questioned the budget impact. Mr. Dunn noted the impact would be minimal. Dr. Knapp questioned the AV tech position. This is a high school student position. Question to Mr. O'Connor; are there jobs within the municipality that are not paid minimum wage? Mr. O'Connor noted there are jobs that are not paid minimum wage.

Ms. French noted the question will be brought back at the October meeting. The Committee noted and discussed the difference in the para sub rates and the teacher sub rates.

## H. Marching in Fair Parade

The Committee discussed participation in the Parade. Ms. French noted that Committee members and district staff marched in the parade. She invited any district employee to join them. School Committee members will be marching in the parade.

  Dr. Laughner noted this policy was not discussed, was tabled at the P&P meeting.

  Dr. Laughner noted changes to the policy were "EPIpens" changed to
  epinephrine, strike in last paragraph. Amended policy will be sent to the
  Committee to review and vote at next meeting. Ms. French questioned the
  Narcan portion of the policy. Ms. DuComb explained the state regulations. The
  schools are regulated on giving Narcan for use. Schools can train but cannot use
  school supply of Narcan. Anyone can carry their own Narcan.

  Dr. Laughner asked the Committee to review for vote at next meeting. Superintendent
  Coffin brought before the P&P committee for review.
